

Classless IP addresses

The method of allocating address space according to need is known as CIDR ^[1]. Further information about this strategy may be found in RFC ^[1] 1519, *Classless Inter-Domain Routing (CIDR): an Address Assignment and Aggregation Strategy* ^[2].

All information sent across the Internet is encapsulated into IP datagrams. At present IPv4 is used: see RIPE-405 ^[3], the RIPE ^[1] document for IPv4 Address Allocation and Assignment Policies.
