What is it?



- eduroam is a European research and education initiative, now worldwide
- It is provided by Jisc in the UK (provider of the Janet network)
- Over 100* hospital sites with eduroam enabled in the UK (*as at 2014)







Overview



- Network connectivity solution that works irrespective of the user's location
- Federated service, now available throughout nearly all higher education campuses in the UK
- Available worldwide







Benefits?




- Many(!), but key:
- Free Wi-Fi for the user at huge number of locations through a single Wi-Fi profile.
- Huge savings in time for both the individual and the service-providing organisation due to reduced guest account management
- Encourages inter-institution collaborative working...








How eduroam works when the user roams

Borders Visited area




Home area **University of Edinburgh** Home site and the reply is returned via the national RADIUS infrastructure.








Some stats...

- 3rd most frequently encountered SSID globally
- ~300 participating organisations in over 74 territories
- >55 million current credentials issued
- Handles ~ 0.5 million unique devices per month
- Processes ~30 million authentication transactions per month









2. So – specifics for University of Edinburgh...

- For UoE business drivers the staff and student experience.
- Access to systems (online marking), email (can be blocked in areas)...
- Majority of staff in both organisations have dual contracts.
- 90% + UG medical teaching provided by NHS Staff.
- Students attend NHS Sites as part of clinical placements.
- 4th/5th Year medical students are effectively junior doctors.
- FY1 are due to be utilising newer technology in NHS Lothian.
- Technology is now intrinsically embedded on all aspects of work.









NHS Lothian eduroam update September 2015

Background

Further to ongoing work to rollout the Eduroam wireless solution in partnership with NHS Lothian, below is a helpful table to help manage expectations around approximate coverage and connectivity.

Key information:

- The broad statement around an approximate coverage of "Everywhere" in some locations, should be taken with some
 caveats:
 - There will be Eduroam coverage where there is an existing NHS Wireless signal.
 - Wireless signals can travel through walls and therefore may be picked up in locations "nearby" to another WAP.
 - It is assumed that this will not be in all locations (intensive care areas, cupboards, toilets).
 - A process will be put in place to help capture locations, once the rollout has been completed, which do not provide adequate Eduroam coverage. Partnership discussions will then take place with NHS Lothian to help fund appropriate areas for growth.
- The total available bandwidth, across the estate, is shared between a maximum of 500 concurrent users is approximately
 a downstream speed of 170 Mbps, and an upstream speed of 85 Mbps. Usage, where possible, will be monitored each
 year to help identify opportunities to improve connectivity.
- Only the main sites listed above offer Wireless connectivity. Therefore anywhere within NHS Lothian where NHS wireless connectivity is available, "eduroam" is advertised.
- Conversely, to clarify, anywhere there is not an NHS Lothian wireless signal, there will not be an Eduroam signal.
- There is no NHS Wireless coverage (and therefore no Eduroam coverage) in GPs or other small sites.
- The exception is the Sick Kids, which is currently getting WAP's installed at present, but nothing is live / active yet.

Update on NH5 Lothian roadmap - 25/09/2015

Different "local Solution(s)" or approaches

- University of Dundee provided a fantastic reciprocal Shared Wi-Fi Service.
 - Due to locality and hardware.
- University of Edinburgh has taken the approach to work with the NHS Board(s) to ask them to become Eduroam partners in their own right as a "visited institution".
- Ideally we would like to provide a reciprocal Wi-Fi service to benefit everyone, but where this is not possible, I feel the "visited institution" approach is the cleanest.




